Dr. Melody Brown Burkins is Director of the Institute of Arctic Studies, Senior Associate Director in the John Sloan Dickey Center for International Understanding, and Adjunct Professor of Environmental Studies at Dartmouth. She also serves as Special Advisor and Assembly Member of the University of the Arctic (UArctic) global network, an elected member of the International Science Council (ISC) Governing Board, Chair of the U.S. National Academies' Board on International Scientific Organizations (BISO), and Past Chair of the U.S. National Committee for Geological Sciences (USNC-GS). Born in Fairbanks, Alaska, and with a career spanning work in both higher education and government (including time as policy advisor in the U.S. Senate) Burkins is an advocate for policy-engaged scholarship, science diplomacy education, and the engagement of more diverse knowledge systems, community voices, gender inclusion, and youth in decision-making for Arctic and global policies. She currently serves on the Advisory Board to the UN Office of Disaster Risk Reduction Global Assessment Report (UNDRR-GAR) and the 15-Member UNESCO Global Independent Expert Group on Universities and the 2030 Agenda (EGU2030). She recently contributed to the 2021 ISC Missions for Science report and gave editorial oversight to the ISC programs for Combatting Systemic Racism in Science. Dr. Burkins received her BS in Geology from Yale University and her PhD from Dartmouth, where she studied paleoclimate and soil biogeochemistry in the Antarctic Dry Valleys.
