






## **Net4Mobility+ project**

- Recommendation for Widening Countries' MSCA NCPs
- Aim is to analyze the participation of the Widening Countries in MCA /MSCA and make the final recommendation on what instruments can be introduced to be more successful in H2020


## Participation of Widening countries in FP

- Comparing FP7 and H2020 60% of the Widening countries are lagging behind FP7 average pace or show worse performance in MSCA
- Number of ITN coordinators still stays extremely low in H2020
- Share of Widening countries in MSCA budget decreased for the period 2014 -2017
- EU 13 countries receive **3,9%** of the total MSCA funding
- All 27 widening countries receive **6,6%** of MSCA budget



### Widening participation

- All 27 Widening countries scored 15,6% as destination countries for long term mobility
- Widening countires have significantly decreased the % of fellows from their own nationality, but have increased the % of fellows from EU 15 and TC







## **Barriers to FP participation**

#### Structural

- Lack of national strategy and vision
- Not appropriate level of national funding to enhance FP participation
- Lack of leading universities and research organisations
- Low researchers salaries
- Lack of up-to-date research infrastructure
- Low involvement at European and international level
- Accessibility and attractiveness of Structural Funds

#### Organizational

- Lack of professional and administrative support
- Low level of professional English, personal competence and capacity
- Lack of funding to initiate international meetings and enhance international collaborations
- Low success rates in FP
- Difficulties to get into a good consortium
- Perception of high administrative burdens of FP projects

- In most Widening countries there is no national strategy or action plan for the participation in MSCA
- Good practice in some countries: national grant for proposal preparation, financial support for project with score above 85%, funding for preparatory meetings, conferences, workshops, etc



## Net4Mobility+ Strategic Recommendations for NCPs

- 1. Initiate and contribute to develop a national action plan for mobility of researchers: cooperation with national stakeholders (ministries, funding agencies, universities, research institutes, business sectors); improving and promoting research conditions
- 2. Establish closer cooperation with thematic NCPs, policy makers and other FP/H2020 related networks (EEN, EURAXESS, MCAA)
- 3. Multiply/decentralise the NCP work contact regional/local offices/institutions and spread information on FP/H2020/MSCA
- 4. Increase number of staff/experts responsible for MSCA or helping the MSCA NCP work by providing more professional advice/trainings for the researchers and host institutions



## Net4Mobility+ Practical Recommendations for NCPs

- 1. Organisation of regular meetings with the management level of research organisations/universities
- 2. Organisation of cross-border regional info days and B2B meetings/brokerage events with the participation of industry
- 3. Organisation of targeted meetings /workshops/ trainings with MSCA fellows/beneficiaries
- 4. Organisation of trainings/workshops for the administrative personnel of research organisations/universities preparing supporting materials on financial and administrative management of MSCA in national languages
- 5. Organisation of webinars on H2020/MSCA
- 6. Participation in knowledge-exchange activities (e.g. twinning sessions including more experienced MSCA NCPs) to learn from the national NCP system, share experience and best practice



## MSCA Individual Fellowship – Widening panel

• Budget from Work Programme part 15: Spreading Excellence and Widening Participation:

- The award criteria, scoring and threshold for MSCA apply
- The MSCA-IF model grant agreement and the unit costs applicable to MSCA-IF will also apply to the Widening Fellowships.
- Applications to the 2019 call for MSCA Individual Fellowships, where the host organisation is located in widening country, is automatically transferred in Widening fellowships in case their proposal is not funded in the regular MSCA-IF call
